




COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING

Each participant was given 2 minutes to express their opinions on AYUSH or Allopathy. The students showcased their critical thinking, public speaking and analytical skills infront of a panel of judges. The participants were well prepared and presented the arguments with confidence and clarity. Speaking for AYUSH, Ms Shereena bagged the first prize, Ms Arshia Tomy recieved second prize and Ms Mahima bagged third prize. Speaking in favour of Allopathy, Ms Angelina bagged first prize, Ms Rejeena got second prize and Ms Arpitha bagged third prize.

The conclusion of the debate as expressed by the participants is as follows-

AYUSH is an acronym for Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homeopathy and are the six Indian systems of medicine practiced mostly in India and some of the neighboring Asian countries. Ayurveda is the prime followed by Yoga Unani and Siddha. These traditional systems of medicine focus mainly on preventive, promotive and curative aspects by using herbs, plants, physical postures, healthy diets, meditations, etc. AYUSH proposes locating the root of an illness and then removing it all together, while Allopathy believes in providing patients with immediate comfort by eliminating the infection or ailment. AYUSH is the traditional medicine system that lead to side benefits rather than side effects. Ayurveda system of medicine is the traditional system of medicine of India, which developed almost 5000 years ago. The word Ayurveda means the science of life. Ayurveda is a part of Atharva Veda.

Allopathic Medicines is a term that describes what people consider to be modern medicine. Healthcare Professionals who practice allopathic medicine tend to take an evidenced based approach when they treat disease with these medicines. These are medicines which are made using extensively, researched and tested treatment. It gives an instant effect.

Additionally there is little to no scientific evidence that supports homeopathy or AYUSH practices as being effective. Now, suppose there is a situation where a person is going under cardiac arrest and is getting critical then at that time what will you choose for his treatment to save his life: Allopathy or AYUSH?
